Project Summary

Various New Acquisitions, Portable Works

Houston Arts Alliance (HAA) is a local arts and culture organization whose principal work is to implement the City of Houston's vision, values, and goals for its arts grant making and civic art investments. HAA's work is conducted through contracts with the City of Houston, overseen by the Mayor's Office of Cultural Affairs. HAA also executes privately funded special projects to meet the needs of the arts community, such as disaster preparation, research on the state of the arts in Houston, and temporary public art projects that energize neighborhoods. Through a contract with the City of Houston, the HAA Civic Art + Design team works in close partnership with the Mayor's Office of Cultural Affairs, the General Service Department, and the Houston Airport System to enhance Houston's visual landscape through the City of Houston Civic Art Program. The City of Houston funds the program via the Civic Art Ordinance. Permanent artworks commissioned and acquired through the Civic Art Program become part of the City of Houston Art Collection, which occupies over 100 of the City's public facilities and parks.

Project Overview

Budget: A total of \$980,000.00 available for the purchase of 87 works.

Submission Deadline: Monday, August 3, 2020 at 11:59 pm CST

Location: George Bush Intercontinental/Houston Airport (IAH) and William P. Hobby Airport (HOU)

Eligibility: Artists from Texas and/or residing in the State of Texas

Results: HAA received 632 eligible submissions form across Texas. The HAA Selection Panel process identified 88 Artworks which were recommend to the City of Houston for acquisition. The City of Houston has reviewed the recommendations and approved 74 of the artworks at a total cost of \$846,065.50 for final selection and acquisition.

The City of Houston through the Mayor's Office of Cultural Affairs (MOCA) and Houston Airport System (HAS) released opportunities to acquire artworks from practicing, professional Texas artists (Artists born in Texas and/or residing in Texas), for direct purchase. Artworks selected through this process will be purchased and added to the City of Houston Civic Art Collection for permanent display at HAS. Qualifying artworks include small to medium size 3-D works, and medium to large 2-D works are eligible to submit.

In coordination with MOCA, HAS is making a major investment in new "Portable Works" for both George Bush Intercontinental and William P. Hobby Airports to offer support for local artists and arts organization during this challenging time, while adding quality work to our collection of public art. Art objects that are not permanently sited or integrated into a structure are considered "Portable Works", and can be displayed in various locations in accordance with the needs of the collection and Houston Airports. This effort is made possible by the City of Houston Civic Art Program. The funds are allocated by the City of Houston ordinance that mandates 1.75% of qualified Capital Improvement Project dollars be set aside for civic art.

Houston Airports is the City of Houston's Department of Aviation. Comprised of George Bush Intercontinental Airport (IAH), William P. Hobby Airport (HOU) and Ellington Airport (EFD) / Houston Spaceport, Houston Airports served nearly 60 million passengers in 2019. Houston Airports form one of North America's largest public airport systems and position Houston as the international passenger and cargo gateway to the South Central United States and a primary gateway to Latin America. Civic Art at Houston Airports enhance the passenger experience by building and presenting a distinguished and

comprehensive collection of Texas artists that demonstrates the impressive talent and vast diversity of the local art community.


